Open Forum: Helen Shifrin, Scott and Jana Smithwick.

- Helen Shifrin presented her concerns for the common area at the side of her property at 1930 HX. These concerns will be forwarded to the Board for a decision.
- Scott & Jana Smithwick presented three areas of concern: 1) unsightly stipa grass at 1867 HX this area will be watched if stipa continues to look shabby after spring growth, Medallion will replace; 2) muddy area in triangular lawn near 1867 HX (problem due to one valve for two areas with vastly different watering requirements). Tim is providing a bid to install a drain in this area; 3) ground-level lighting needed for narrow, dark passageway from garages to 1867 committee asked them to forward this request to the Board through Bill Hubbard.

I. Review of Irrigation Issues

• Reviewed irrigation issues. Medallion working on valves on traffic islands across from 1880 HX and across from 2070 FX.

II. Review of Ongoing Work

- Medallion to complete re-seeding of grass where trees were removed last year.
- Now that crape myrtle trees have been pruned, hard pruning of abelia and escalonia hedges will be done.
- Locquat trees at entrance were pruned.

IV. Review of Recent New Work

- Recent work included pruning of the crape myrtles and many plants throughout the complex.
- All evergreen pear trees have now been pruned so future prunings will be covered in Medallion's regular maintenance contract.
- Hamilton Place entrance on Greenwich side is in progress should be completed soon.
- Other smaller projects completed on Ashmeade, Huxley and Foxhall.

V. Review of New Bids

• Committee-approved bids at this meeting include work on Foxhall, Huxley and Greenwich. These include additional plants to fill in some sparsely planted areas, or replace ones that died.

VI. Long Term Planning

- Medallion will prepare a bid to re-landscape the area at 1846-1848 Ashmeade recently dug up due to a gas leak. This will be forwarded to the Board for approval.
- The committee will continue to look for areas where plants have died or are distressed and replace as needed.
- In compliance with SCVWD requirements for the completed turf removal projects, the complex will be mulched in the spring.
- Medallion will be removing the kikuyu grass from the lawns along Leigh Avenue in the spring.
