Open Forum

Call to Order: Co-chair Maryalice Heim convened the meeting to review ongoing and needed work at 3:00 p.m.

Ongoing Work

Review of Maintenance Concerns and Recent New Work

- Medallion is focusing on general clean up, seasonal weed spraying and will continue to address irrigation issues as they arise.
- Medallion has started hard pruning oversized hedges and shrubs in the complex

Irrigation

- Medallion has completed installation of the new irrigation clocks which have been programmed to water twice a
 week.
- Medallion has started the semiannual irrigation system check.
- The frequency and duration of irrigation continues to be closely monitored and adjustments will be made as needed for changes in the weather.
- Irrigation issues continue to be problematic, including repairs of broken lateral lines and sprinklers. Medallion has been working diligently to correct the problems in a timely fashion. Three irrigation problems were recently resolved two on Ashmeade and one on Huxley. The Board and committee appreciate any heads-up from residents in detecting water leaks as well as curbing personal water usage.

Review of Bids

- Committee has requested Medallion to provide a design and bid for the "1600 Hamilton Place" planters at the main entrance
- Medallion to submit remaining bids requested by committee so work can be scheduled for 2018.

Long-Term Planning

The Committee continues to identify areas for turf and hedge removals and prioritizes work for completion in a
multi-year plan. This plan focuses on water conservation and includes capping sprinklers and installing mulch or
rock; replacing turf with drought-tolerant landscaping and using high efficiency sprinklers, as appropriate. The
Board focus is to save water and install size-appropriate landscaping to reduce maintenance (trimming)
requirements.

Trees

- Medallion has planted the five replacement trees for the removal of 4 Loquat trees and 1 dead Eucalyptus tree.
- Committee has compiled a list of problematic trees to be considered by the Board for removal in 2018.
- Medallion has completed spraying Plum trees for fruit reduction.
- Medallion will start spraying the Hackberry Trees for aphids.
