Call to Order: Co-Chair, Maryalice convened the meeting to review ongoing and needed work at 2:00 p.m.

Ongoing Work: Review of Maintenance Concerns and Recent New Work

• Medallion's focus will be on landscaping clean up, trimming and removal of weeds/suckers and liquid amber seed pods.

Irrigation: The frequency and duration of irrigation continues to be closely monitored and adjustments are made as needed for changes in the weather or to accommodate new plantings.

- Medallion addresses irrigation issues as they arise.
- Irrigation is set to water 3 times per week.
- The Board and committee appreciate resident diligence in curbing personal water usage as well as any heads-up in detecting water leaks or faulty sprinklers.

Review of New Projects and Recently Approved Work

- Medallion has submitted most of 2025 bids and remaining bids will be sent by the end of April. Work has started and will be completed by the beginning of May.
- Medallion's bid for the April and July Grub treatments has been approved and the first treatment has been scheduled.

Long-Term Planning: The Board focus for landscape improvement is to conserve water and install size-appropriate landscaping to reduce maintenance (trimming) requirements.

- Security: The committee and Medallion continue to identify areas to improve visibility and lines of sight where lights are blocked by bushes. This can involve hard pruning or removing bushes and/or using lower plant height to increase visibility. The committee appreciates any suggestions for improving security affected by landscape.
- Long-term plan includes maintaining lines of sight and visibility, water conservation, capping sprinklers when possible, installing mulch or rock; and replacing turf with drought-tolerant, size-appropriate landscaping, using high efficiency sprinklers, as needed.
- The committee is also working with Medallion to keep shrubbery pruned away from buildings and fences and to keep dirt and mulch away from the bottom fence boards.

Trees

Hackberry trees will be treated for Aphids in April and July.
