Hamilton Place Security - Ken Sweezey - Secretary

Next to landscaping, security is our 2nd largest maintenance expense item. The 2010 budget for security is \$2600/month, covering the salary expense of our three security officers who patrol the complex, 4 hours daily. You may have seen Roger, Eric or Mike on their patrols, sometimes on foot and sometimes in their vehicle. Their patrol times vary around the 24 hour clock, 7 days a week.

All three are or have been a sworn police officer for San Jose Police Department. Roger retired a few years ago from SJPD after 30 years of service and has handled Hamilton Place security since the complex opened in the early 80's. Eric is currently a SJPD officer with 15 years of service and has worked for the HOA for 10 years. Mike is also currently a SJPD officer with 15 years of service and 5 years with the HOA. All three officers enjoy their work with us and treat the complex as their own.

The Board of Directors provides the security officers with a bill of work, specifying certain activities to be done on a daily basis. Such activities include:

· Patrol of all streets and walkways.

- Check of all parking areas and logging of vehicles in Open and Guest spaces.
- · Check of dumpsters for diver activity.
- · Unit checks when resident is out-of-town.
- Follow-up on incidents with residents.
- · Coordination with regular SJPD patrols.
- Check for transients in the area.



As friendly as our three security officers are, they are trained to be alert and suspicious. Their communication skills are honed to handle interactions of all sorts with

all types of people. We can count on them to help keep our neighborhood safe.

If you have the chance, introduce yourself when you see one on patrol. They'll appreciate the contact and encourage you to communicate with them anytime you see or hear something out of the ordinary. They'll tell you to call **911** in emergencies and to contact them at the HOA Security Office (in the Clubhouse building) at **408-371-1715** to report something or to let them know you'll be out-of-town.

Landscape Committee Report

The Board of Directors provides a budget to the Committee which determines the guidelines that the Committee must adhere to in planning for landscaping maintenance and upgrade projects. Currently, the Committee is working on the following projects:

- Tree Removals and Replacements 19 trees that are overgrown for the area or diseased are scheduled to be removed throughout the complex. Trees will be replaced on a 1:1 ratio where space permits. The project is pending approval by the San Jose Planning Department. An informational sign has been posted at the Clubhouse.
- Tree Trimming Lewis Tree Service has a few areas of additional trimming work that will be completed early in the year.
- Landscape Renovations Work will continue in the spring in a number of areas throughout the complex, replacing grass and ivy planting beds with drought tolerant shrubs and plants, mulched and edged.

Master and Earthquake Insurance Renewal

The master and earthquake insurance packages will renew in late March. Additional information regarding the renewal rates and levels of coverage will be included in the April Newsletter. The Association typically borrows money from the reserves to pay off the annual premiums for the insurance package at the time of the renewal and then pays back the reserves by the end of the fiscal year. This year the association may have to borrow up to \$145,000 from the reserves to help cover the insurance renewal premiums. Again, the borrowed funds will be repaid to the reserves by the end of 2010.




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
