Hamilton Place History (Part 4) - Ken Sweezey - Secretary

As mentioned previously as part of Hamilton Place History, Broadmoor Homes received San Jose City Council approval in December 1978 to develop the 82 acres of Ainsley orchards. Originally, a major shopping center development was proposed for

the entire parcel and, after 17 years of battling, the project was scaled down to 54 acres of residential units and 28 acres of commercial property. Here is what 1600 Hamilton Place was planned to look like in 1981. Can you spot the differences to today?

Landscape Committee Report

The Board of Directors provides a budget to the Committee which determines the guidelines that the Committee must adhere to in planning for landscaping maintenance and upgrade projects. Currently, the Committee is working on the following projects:

- Maintenance Issues Work is continuing throughout the complex for the control of weeds, snails, mushrooms and mildew. The Medallion crew is doing some light pruning of shrubs and trimming groundcover.
- Irrigation Issues The Medallion crew is continuing to monitor and adjust the sprinkler controllers and heads/emitters to balance the system.
- Current Project Work Medallion is reseeding some lawn areas as needed, as well as replacing distressed plantings.
- Tree Trimming and Removals Lewis Tree Service will be trimming trees during the next month. There will also be some removals of trees that are overgrown for the area or diseased/damaged.
- Long Term Planning Sheba and Maryalice are developing long term plans for future upgrades, turf removals, mulching and header boards. In addition, the Committee is working with Medallion to streamline communications and improve project delivery times.

Neighborhood Watch

One of the advantages to living in a common interest development such as 1600 Hamilton Place is that the community can help prevent crime or vandalism by keeping an eye out for any suspicious activity. If you see any type of activity that appears to be suspicious in nature, contact San Jose Police at 911



immediately. Don't be shy. Take the initiative to prevent crime in our neighborhood!

A word about the Hamilton Place Security – our HOA in association with the Hamilton Place Cottages townhomes and the Hamilton Place Corners condominiums, hire off-duty or retired San Jose Police Officers to patrol the complexes. The main duties of these patrol officers is to help the associations enforce parking rules, as well as provide a visual deterrent for crime or vandalism. Please remember that the San Jose Police Department should be contacted any time you feel that there is a safety issue or matter that involves law infractions.

Annual Tree Trimming

The HOA has scheduled the trimming of selected trees in the common area during the next month. It is also a good time to inspect the large shrubs and trees in your backyard or entry area to make sure they are trimmed so that there is at least 3-5 feet of building clearance. This will help keep the gutters and downspouts clear and is also a good deterrent for squirrels or roof rats from gaining access to the roof or attic area of our buildings. All trees should be trimmed prior to the HOA annual gutter cleaning, which is scheduled for November. If you would like to make arrangements for trimming your trees by using the HOA's tree service company, at your cost, please contact Lewis Tree Service at 831-476-1200.

Pool Schedule

The heat to the pools will be shut off sometime during the month of October, depending on the weather.

Dryer Vent Cleaning Reimbursement

The Association will reimburse you 50% of the invoice, up to \$45, for having your dryer vent cleaned by either The Vent Cleaner (800-793-0333) or AAA Furnace and Air Conditioning (408-293-4717). After the cleaning is completed, forward a copy of the paid invoice to Bill Hubbard.



For protection against lint and debris build-up, which could eventually result in a fire, this should be done every 1-2 years, depending on how often you use your dryer. You can also help keep your vent clean by making sure that the lint trap on your dryer is cleaned prior to each use.
