# **Security Update**

Unfortunately, there were a few burglaries in the complex over the past month. The burglaries occurred during the day when the resident was not home. There have been no reports about any burglaries in the other two complexes making up Hamilton Place, the Cottages and the Corners. SJPD confirms that there have been recent daytime burglaries on nearby Stokes Avenue as well.

What can you do? Start thinking like a burglar! Look around your unit through the eyes of a burglar. A sliding patio door is hidden behind your fence and can be jimmied or pried up off the track. There are many ways to secure the door, including stop bars and frame pins.

Burglars are most likely not going to risk making noise by breaking glass. Instead, they'll look for a quieter way to gain entrance, an unlocked window or a garage door left open make it easy for a quick burglar. They only need a few minutes to riffle through your belongings. They're looking for smaller items such as jewelry,

electronics and memorabilia. They're not going to risk being seen carrying your large screen TV out the front door.

People pursuing a career in residential burglaries know their craft and have an alibi ready if you catch them inside your patio or looking through a window. They'll tell you anything to try to allay your fear and make a graceful escape. They'll tell you they are looking for their friend or that they just needed a drink of water from your hose and didn't want to bother anybody. Don't believe them, tell them to leave and close/lock your door. Make some noise!

Many neighbors have a security system with a panic alarm which can be activated to sound an alarm and contact a central command center. If your car is parked close, you can activate its alarm to make noise. Burglars don't like noise.

If you see something happening, call 911 or 277-8911.

To report something after the fact, call 311 or 277-8900.

# Landscape Committee Report

The Board of Directors provides a budget to the Committee which determines the guidelines that the Committee must adhere to in planning for landscaping maintenance and upgrade projects.

- At this time, the spring irrigation check is being completed by Medallion's irrigation technician. This check is done semi-annually, in the fall and spring. Based on the fall check, Medallion recommended repairs and upgrades which were approved by the Board and completed last month. Medallion will be issuing a spring report, based on this inspection, including additional recommendations for repairs and upgrades. If you see an area where water is puddling, please let CMS Customer Service know.
- Medallion is currently working on pruning hedges, as well as cleaning up
  the liquid amber spikeballs. They will continue to drop into May until the
  trees are fully leafed out. After the cleaning has been completed, the
  complex will be mulched to retain moisture and improve appearance.
- Maryalice will be contacting Lewis Trees to do the spring walk-through. Based on the walk-through, as well as the planned schedule of work for the trees in our complex, they formulate a tree-trimming and removal plan for the year.

### **Exterior Changes to your Unit**

Please remember that the governing documents for the Hamilton Place Community Association require that all changes to the exterior appearance of your unit must have prior approval from the Board of Directors. This means that anytime you want to change the design of your entry or patio areas, you must first provide a written request for approval to the Board describing, in detail, the proposed changes. Failure to do so may result in the Board requiring that you change the modification, at your expense. The reason for this rule is to maintain the overall appearance of the complex as originally intended by the developer.

The CC&Rs stipulate that all doors and windows are the responsibility of the unit owners. Please make sure you have approval from the Board prior to installing new windows, doors and exterior light fixtures. In addition, the exterior of all window coverings must be white or off-white. The architectural guidelines and the change application are available on the HOA website at www.1600hamiltonplace.org.

### Springtime Patio Cleanup

When you cleanup your patio landscaping, please hold your green waste until the regular City pickup on Wednesday. Instead of putting it out early where we all have to look at it, many residents hold their green waste on their patio until Tuesday. Help keep our neighborhood looking good!





### **Pool and Spa Health Concerns**

The pools have been heated since May 1st and its time for the annual reminder of keeping our pools and spa safe and healthy for everyone.

- Parents, you can help to keep the pool clean. Make regular bathroom breaks a part of your kid's time at the pool. Teach children not to pee in the pool. Also, check swim diapers often. Waiting to hear "I have to go" may mean that it's too late. Please change diapers in the bathroom and not at poolside.
- To avoid getting sick from recreational water illnesses, teach your children not to swallow pool water and to avoid getting water in their mouths.
- To keep germs, dirt and sweat out of the water and protect the health of other swimmers, please shower before using the pool. Parents, please teach your children to wash their hands thoroughly with soap and water after using the pool restrooms. Never allow your kids in the pool when they have diarrhea.

The Board is currently developing renovation plans for the restrooms in our two pools. In addition, an outdoor shower similar to the one at the Foxhall pool will be installed at the Huxley pool.
