NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

WE LOOK OUT FOR EACH OTHER!

Its been about a year since we had our Neighborhood Watch kickoff meeting in the clubhouse with about 60 residents in attendance. Since then, Neighborhood Watch signs have become more visible throughout the community and, from all accounts, many residents have increased their awareness by keeping their eyes and ears open for any suspicious activity.

Over the past month, our HOA Security office received a number of calls reporting a suspicious individual in the area. In addition, there were reports that there was a shopping cart full of stuff



seen in different areas around the complex. Our Security officers kept a lookout for the cart and the individual, fol-

lowing leads left by residents on the HOA Security office voicemail.

The break in the case came in late April when the shopping cart was observed by a concerned resident near the Foxhall pool and she promptly reported it to the HOA Security office. One of our Security officers found the individual sleeping on the Foxhall tennis court a few hours later. A check of the individual's identification was accomplished and he has moved along.

Other than this vagrant, there have been very few reports in any of the three condominium complexes that make up the 1600 Hamilton Place community. Fortunately, the burglary attempts and car break-ins that we experienced a few years ago have subsided.

Nonetheless, there are things that you can do to protect your property and family. First of all, start thinking like a burglar! Look around your unit through the eyes of a burglar. A sliding patio door that is hidden behind your fence and can be jimmied or pried up off the track is an easy entry for

an eager burglar. There are many ways to secure a patio door, including stop bars and frame pins.

Burglars are most likely not going to risk making noise by breaking glass. Instead, they'll look for a quieter way to gain entrance, an unlocked window or a garage door left open make it easy for a quick burglar. They only need a few minutes to riffle through your belongings. They're looking for

smaller items such as jewelry, electronics and memorabilia. They're not going to risk being seen carrying your large screen TV out the front door.

People pursuing a career in residential burglaries know their craft and have an alibi ready if you catch them inside your patio or looking through a window. They'll tell you anything to try to allay your fears and make a graceful escape. They'll tell you they are looking for their friend or that they just wanted a drink of water from your hose and didn't want to bother anybody. Don't believe them, tell them to leave and close/lock your door. If necessary, make some noise (burglars don't like noise).

If you feel threatened, call **911** (or 408-277-8911) for police assistance. To report something to the police after the fact, call **311** (or 408-277-8900).

When you are able, call our HOA Security office voicemail (408-371-1715) to leave a report for our officers.

Landscape Committee Report

The Board of Directors provides a budget and determines the guidelines that must be adhered to for landscaping maintenance and upgrade projects.

The current focus of work is on completing the hard pruning of shrubbery as well as removal of liquid amber seed pods. The first phase of a 3 year plan for mature hedge replacements along Leigh Avenue has been completed. The Ashmeade gas trench repairs have been completed. The Committee is working with Lewis Tree Service to develop a multi-year plan for the removal of problematic and/or diseased trees, including a plan for replacements.

The Committee continues to monitor the landscaping and one significant issue is the loss of plants due to dog owner's failure to prevent their dogs from urinating on shrubbery. Dog owners, please control your dog.

Pool and Spa Health Concerns

The pools have been heated since May 1st and its time for the annual reminder of keeping our pools and spa safe and healthy for everyone.

Parents, you can help to keep the pool clean. Make regular bathroom breaks a part of your kid's time at the pool. Teach kids not to relieve themselves in the pool. Also, check swim diapers often. Waiting to hear "I have to go" may mean that it's too late. If possible, please change diapers in the bathroom and not at poolside.



- To avoid getting sick from recreational water illnesses, teach your children not to swallow pool water and to avoid getting water in their mouths.
- To keep germs, dirt and sweat out of the water and protect the health of other swimmers, please shower before using the pool. Parents, please teach your children to wash their hands thoroughly with soap and water after using the pool restrooms. Never allow your kids in the pool when they have diarrhea.

The Board is currently developing renovation plans for the restrooms in our two pools. Bids have been received and the work will probably be done in the Fall.
