Neighborhood Watch Update

Its been over two months since we've had a reported garage break-in. Over the past six months, we had over 10 reports of vehicle or detached garage burglaries. Our experience mirrors that of the entire Bay Area as ALL SUSPICIOUS PERSONS AND ACTIVITIES reported by the media.

Many residents took action to deactivate garage door opener key locks and/or emergency

cable release locks. Hamilton Place Security has increased foot patrols and are more visible on our streets thanks to Security signs on their vehicles. They advise residents to be aware of their surroundings and to use common sense in evaluating situations they encounter. If you see something or someone that is out of place, observe and report. Call 911 to alert SJPD to the situation and leave a message with Hamilton Place Security so they can be aware of the situation.



In early April, SJPD apprehended a felon on Huxley Court. Residents had reported him to SJPD over the previous few days and provided a description of his car. He had multiple felony warrants out on him and did not want to go back to jail. The SJPD response was swift and strong, taking the suspect into custody. It is undetermined if he was re-

sponsible for the recent burglaries.

Here's a few easy things you can do to protect your property and family:

- Don't leave items visible in your car.
- Secure your patio doors and windows with frame pins and stop bars.
- Install and use a home and car alarm.

Clubhouse Pool Project

The Clubhouse pool and spa renovation project took a few weeks more than planned, but the end result was well worth the wait. The project was planned for in the reserve funding and was made up of two major elements, replacing the original concrete decking and replastering both the pool and spa.

The interlocking paver stones are produced locally and will enable future repairs to the underground pipes and conduit to be done without heavy jack-The replastering is done hammering. about every 10 years and is closely regulated to ensure all current health and safety issues are addressed.

In addition to the decking and replastering, all underground water pipes and drainage pipes were replaced, as well as all ladders and other accessories. The Landscape Committee worked with Medallion to reinvigorate the planting beds and grass area. Work will continue in the area with attention to the fence and rest-

- Pool and spa use is reserved for residents and their invited guests.
- An adult resident must accompany anyone under the age of 14.
- No smoking, pets, glassware or food preparation in the pool/spa area.
- Infants must wear swim diapers made for use in a pool.
- No floatation devices, balls or toys.
- Respect your neighbors living near the area and keep noise to a minimum.

- Dog Duty Please remember that dogs are to be leashed at all times
 while in the common areas of the complex. In addition, dogs are not
 permitted in the Clubhouse, pool or tennis courts. Also, please clean up
 after your dog and encourage other dog owners to do the same.
- Free Car Wash There are two free cash wash areas in the complex, one
 on Greenwich and one on Foxhall. It is a HOA violation to wash vehicles
 on the interior streets by the garages or parking areas.
- Bugbusters Call 408-262-1968 if you see any bug activity outside your unit. The HOA has a fixed contract and there's no charge to the resident.
- Green Waste Pickup Green waste is picked up early on Wednesday morning. Please do not put your green waste out early so that it doesn't get blown away and everyone else doesn't have to look at it.

Irrigation system repairs are being handled as issues arise. New projects includes work on Foxhall and re-landscaping the Clubhouse pool and spa planting beds.

The Committee reminds residents not to plant, remove or alter any common area landscaping. They are requested to address their concerns to the Committee via email to Bill Hubbard or attend the next Committee meeting.

Pool and Spa Health Concerns

With the warmer weather, its time for the annual reminders to keep our pools and spa safe and healthy for everyone.

- Parents, you can help to keep the pool clean. Make regular bathroom breaks a part of your kid's time at the pool. Teach kids not to relieve themselves in the pool. Also, check swim diapers often. Waiting to hear "I have to go" may mean that it's too late. If possible, please change diapers in the bathroom and not at poolside.
- To avoid getting sick from recreational water illnesses, teach your children not to swallow pool water and to avoid getting water in their mouths.
- Teach your children to wash their hands thoroughly with soap and water after using the pool restrooms. Never allow your kids in the pool when they have diarrhea.

Water Line Insurance - Not Needed!

You may have received an official looking document that is being sent to some residents that warns of the expense of maintaining and repairing exterior water lines coming into your unit. The sales pitch is to purchase "water line insurance protection". Please be aware that the HOA is responsible for all exterior utilities, including water, gas, electric and sewers. The expense of any such repairs is borne by the HOA and is included in the HOA budget. Hence, it is included in the monthly assessment paid by all owners.
