Annual Meeting of the Membership

Daylight Savings on March 12, 2017 Don't Forget These Maintenance Suggestions

Don't forget to replace the batteries in all of your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors! Daylight savings time is also a good time to check the condition of all water supply lines inside your home – to clothes washer, sinks, dishwasher, and toilets. Finally, don't forget to have your dryer vent inspected and cleaned, if necessary!

Important Information from the Board

The Valley Transportation Authority ("VTA") is proposing some significant changes to its system that will impact bus service near Hamilton Place. Route 65 which runs north/south on Leigh is scheduled to be removed from service. Service on Route 82 which runs east/west on Hamilton will be changed apparently to only becoming a service for Willow Glen high school. If anyone in your household uses bus services you may want to go to nextnetwork.vta.org to see proposed changes to the bus system and how you can communicate your comments on the proposed changes.

Water: Heavy January rains brought some good news, but continued water budget concerns. San Jose Water Company removed surcharge penalties for exceeding allocations, but added a new Public Utility Charge. (SJ Mercury News, 2/3/17) Potential cost impact is being calculated. The San Jose Water Company meets February 8 to decide conservation targets: however, unless SJWC lowers water rates, we will continue to have water budget challenges in the Summer months due to the 28% rate increase last year. The landscape committee is continuing to upgrade to drought-tolerant landscaping and we encourage residents to maintain your conservation efforts. Every dollar we save in the rainy season helps offset Summer water bills.

Landscape: Four new trees (2 Japanese Maple, 2 Crape Myrtle,) were planted on the walking path between Foxhall/Huxley to replace the diseased pear trees. Additionally, the turf and hedges under the new trees will be updated. The 2 diseased trees at the dead-end of Foxhall cannot be re-planted due to underground utility lines. Replacements for these two trees were planted elsewhere in the complex. One additional plum was planted on the circle to replace a plum that died

**Landscape sprinklers have been turned off for the rainy season, unless we don't receive rain for about a week or two. Please report any running water/leaks and the nearest street address to the property manager.

Exterior Changes To Your Unit

Please remember that the governing documents for 1600 Hamilton REQUIRE that ALL changes to the exterior appearance of your unit MUST have PRIOR approval from the Board of Directors. This means

that ANYTIME you want to change an exterior light fixture, a screen door, or even change the design of your entry or patio areas, you must first provide a written request for approval to the Board describing, in detail, the proposed changes. Failure to do so may result in the Board requiring that you change the modification, at your expense. The reason for this rule is to help protect the overall appearance of the complex and prevent an owner from installing something that might result in higher association maintenance expenses or lower real estate values.

Note: The CC&Rs stipulate that all doors and windows are the maintenance responsibility of the unit owners. Please make sure you have approval from the Architectural Committee prior to installing new windows or doors.

Insurance Renewal

The Board may have to borrow funds from the reserves to cover the cost of the master and earthquake policies that renew in March, 2017. Any funds borrowed from the reserves will be re-paid by the end of the year.

SKUNKS?

Have you noticed an increase in skunk sightings (or odors!) this winter? Because of the unusually dry weather, skunks (and other vermin) are seeking food, water, and shelter. It has been noted that some 1600 Hamilton residents continue to place pet food, water, or bird seed out in their patio areas, which provides the incentive for skunks and other vermin to take up residence in the area. PLEASE DO NOT leave any water or food outside and if you know someone who is doing this, please contact association manager Bill Hubbard so that the association can take the necessary disciplinary action so that the activity stops.

Gutter Cleaning

Four Seasons Roofing has completed its second cleaning of the gutters and downspouts. The cleaning carries a "no clog" warranty until May 1, 2017. If you see that your downspout has become CLOGGED <u>after</u> the initial cleaning, please contact the CMS customer service dept during normal business hours WITH THE EXACT LOCATION OF THE CLOG and they will arrange for Four Seasons Roofing to address the problem.
